Lifelong Treasured Civil War Collection Presented to TGS as Gift

Earl Griffith, a lifetime member of TGS, has donated to the Society library a cherished collection of books on the Civil War. Linda Brown, Asst. Librarian has catalogued this collection and it is ready for you to enjoy. There are beautiful works of art (photos) and detail volumes depicting a time affecting all our family histories, regardless of our roles.

There are several collections included and it is impossible to post all of them here. But some of the highlights are: The Civil War Day by Day Desk Diary, The Civil War, A Pictorial Profile, Picture History of the Civil War, The Rise and Fall of the Confederate Government, Generals in Gray; Lives of the Confederate Commanders, Generals in Blue; Lives of the Union Commanders, and Uniforms of the American Civil War.

Featured are some of the National Military Parks including, The Battle of Pea Ridge 1862, in Arkansas; Antietam National Battlefield Site in Maryland; Vicksburg National Military Park, in Mississippi; Gettysburg National Military Park, in Pennsylvania; Fort Sumpter National Military Monument, in South Carolina and Petersburg, Richmond and Manassas (Bull Run) National Military Parks in Virginia.

There are so many more interesting volumes in this collection. Take a trip to the library to view this treasure of Historical Civil War Era resources. Thanks, *Earl*, for sharing such a valued treasure!
